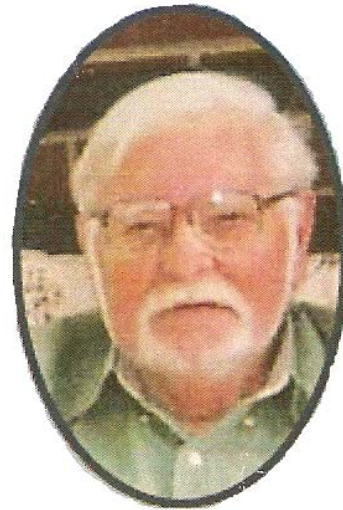

Charles Lucky "C.L." Menius, 83, of Concord, died Oct. 23, 2008, at his home. He was born Jan. 7, 1925, in Cabarrus County, the son of the late Neal and Icie Costner Menius. He was preceded in death by his wife in 2004, Avis Poole Tino Menius, whom he married in May of 1945. He had worked at Cannon Mills Company for more than 30 years. He also was in the restaurant business in Concord for 11 years and was a real estate broker for 11 years at Holden Beach. He was veteran of World War II in the U.S. Navy from 1943 to 1945, having served aboard the USS Snowden, an anti-sub killer on which he earned three battle stars for action against German submarines. He was a life member of the VFW Post 8866 in Holden Beach, a life member of the Destroyer Escort Sailors Association, a charter member (Plank owner) of Destroyer Escort Historical Museum, a life member of Brunswick County Amateur Radio Society and a former member of John R. Mott Y's Men Club. He was a member of Mount Olivet United Methodist Church in Kannapolis and a former member of Sharon United Methodist Church in Holden Beach. He was also a graduate of Evans College, Concord. He is survived by a daughter, Renee Hogan of Salisbury; sons, Arnold Tino

of Kannapolis and Tony L. Menius of Holden Beach; brother, Bobby Menius of Biloxi, Miss.; and sisters, Marcelle Helms of Holden Beach and Atha Hendrix of Concord; seven grandchildren; 18 great-grandchildren; and three great-great-grandchildren. A memorial service will be held at 6 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 25, 2008, at Whitley's Funeral Home Chapel, officiated by the Rev. Brenda Newman. Burial will be private.
