**A**nother chicken sale has come and gone at the Kalihi YMCA. We saw a very positive increase in sales from 875 in 2007 to 1200 whole chickens in 2008. The Kalihi Y's Men's and Women's Club sales were off a bit in 2008. As a

result, profits should be around \$760 for the club.
